Kansas City, MO Charity Program (KCCP)

The Kansas City, MO Charity Program, established by a 1999 ordinance of the City Council, is in its sixteenth year of operation. The ordinance was amended in the spring of 2002 to expand employee options to include agencies that are not part of a federation, yet fit closely with the City's mission and philosophy. The mission of the KCCP is to provide an opportunity for you to continue your long-standing tradition of charitable giving but to an expanded number of charities. The charities listed in this booklet are those who responded to the City's solicitation requesting participation in the campaign, and who have been approved as meeting the guidelines established by ordinance.

You must designate a federation or one of the charities listed in this catalog to receive your contribution. **No "write-ins" will be accepted.** By decision of the KCCP Executive Committee, those employees who do not choose a federation or agency for designation will have their pledge distributed to all of the organizations in the KCCP Charity List in the same proportion that they received designations in the campaign. Those wishing to contribute to agencies that are not listed may do so by contacting the agency directly. Employees participating in the Kansas City, MO Charity Campaign may contribute by cash or check; by bi-weekly payroll deduction; or may have United Way of Greater Kansas City bill you monthly or annually.

Each federation and approved agency listed in this booklet has certified to the City that it meets the following guidelines:

1. That it provides substantial services in the Kansas City metropolitan area.
2. That it is organized and registered for charitable purposes under all applicable Missouri statutes.
3. That it is exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) or section 170(c)(1) or (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, and that it has held that exempt status for at least two years.
4. That it has written policies of non-discrimination and that it complies with all laws and regulations regarding non-discrimination and equal opportunity with respect to clients, officers, employees and volunteers.
5. That a voluntary board of directors governs it and serves without compensation.
6. That it will not contribute funds collected from the KCCP to any political advocacy group.
7. That it ensures promotional activities and printed materials are based upon actual program operations and are truthful, non-deceptive, and include all material facts relative to its cause.
8. That it ensures that publicity and promotional activities protect against unauthorized use of contributor lists.
9. That its administrative fund raising expenses are less than 25% of total support and revenue or that it has a plan to reduce its expenses to less than 25%.
10. That it has an oversight committee that monitors its participating agencies.

The United Way of Greater Kansas City was chosen through a competitive process to administer the KCCP. It will deduct 11% from each donation to cover its administrative expenses and will distribute the remaining funds to the designated agency or affiliated federation that will distribute the funds to your designated charity.
