# AUDIT SCOPE STATEMENT - February 13, 2023

## 2023 Boards and Commissions Governance Risk Assessment

#### Why audit boards and commissions?

Section 2-722 of the Code of Ordinances requires the city auditor to distribute a governance assessment checklist at least once every four years to governing or policy boards of the city and report the results to the Council.

Boards and commissions are responsible for overseeing important public functions and activities in Kansas City, including policing, maintenance of parks, and development incentives. Like elected officials, many boards and commissions are responsible for allocating significant public resources – nearly \$400 million in fiscal year 2022 – and overseeing the delivery of services to Kansas City residents and visitors. Unlike elected officials, however, boards and commissions are not directly accountable to the voters for their actions. Boards and commissions should follow good governance practices as they spend public funds for the public good.

The checklist responses and report are tools the Mayor and City Council can use to assess the governance practices of Kansas City boards and commissions.

### **Audit objective**

Our objective is to answer the following question:

What governance practices are the city's boards and commissions following?

#### **Audit methods**

We will distribute a checklist to boards and commissions that are component units of the city plus the Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners similar in nature to previous years. We will compile and report the responses of these 15 boards and commissions to the city council.

New this year, we will distribute an additional, shortened survey to 27 boards and commissions required to file financial disclosures under Section 2-2024 of the Code of Ordinances. We will compile and report their responses in a separate report.

We plan to issue the audit report in August 2023.
