2023 Governance Assessment: Other Governing and Policy Boards

Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council:

Governance is the exercise of authority, direction, and control by a governing board. Boards and commissions are responsible for overseeing important public functions and activities in Kansas City government, including approving property tax abatements, advertising and booking conventions in the city, and determining city employee retirement benefits. Because of their role, the city code requires the City Auditor to distribute a governance checklist to boards and commissions at least once every four years.

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This is the second governance assessment issued this year. The <u>first report</u> surveyed component unit boards and commissions and the Board of Parks and Recreation.

For this report, we sent governance checklists to 27 boards and commissions whose members are required to file financial disclosures with the city. This was the first year that these boards and commissions were asked to complete the governance checklist. We modified the checklist to remove questions that might not be applicable to the selected boards and commissions. Future governance assessment checklists may be modified based on this year's responses. Twenty-three of these boards and commissions completed and returned the checklist.

Most of the boards and commissions reported incorporating good governance practices to lead their organization, establish board performance and accountability for achieving organizational goals, and representing the public. However, some responses identified opportunities to mitigate risks that can have a negative impact on board performance.

Ten boards responded that the financial disclosure requirement was not applicable, or it was unknown if all members had submitted a financial disclosure with the city clerk. All boards we surveyed have at least some portion of their members who are required by city code to submit a financial disclosure report annually to the city clerk.

Because the Mayor appoints most of the board and commission members, we addressed our recommendations to him. We recommend the Mayor:

- send a letter to all boards and commissions identified in City Code Sec. 2-2024(d) reminding them of their obligation to submit annual financial disclosure statements to the city clerk and the consequences for failing to file, and
- ask the city clerk for a list of all board and commission members who did not submit their required annual financial disclosure on or before June 1, 2023, because according to city code, they have automatically resigned.

We met with staff from the Mayor's Office on October 16, 2023, to discuss report findings and recommendations to the Mayor. We would like to thank all board and commission members for their assistance and cooperation during this audit. 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Introduction

Audit Objective

What governance practices are boards and commissions following?

To answer our objective, we:

- sent electronic surveys to 27 city boards and commissions whose members are required to file annual financial disclosures with the city clerk's office.
- · summarized the survey results, and
- identified the governance risks that boards and commissions may experience if they are not following good governance practices.

The survey information contained in this audit is self-reported. We did not verify responses to the survey questions or determine their reasonableness. We drew conclusions based on the responses received.

We conducted this audit in accordance with Government Auditing Standards with the exception of reporting the views of responsible officials as the recommendations are addressed to the Mayor as the appointing authority.

Background

Kansas City Boards and Commissions

Boards and commissions are responsible for overseeing important public functions and activities in Kansas City including approving property tax abatements, advertising and booking conventions in the city, and determining city employee retirement benefits. Like elected officials, many boards and commissions are responsible for allocating public resources and overseeing the provision of services. Unlike elected officials, these boards and commissions are not directly accountable to the voters for their actions.

Section 2-722 of the Code of Ordinances requires the city auditor to distribute a governance assessment checklist at least once every four years to appropriate governing or policy boards of the city and report the results to the Council. In September 2023, we issued our 2023 Governance Assessment: Component Unit Boards and Commissions report.

In addition to component units, we sent the governance assessment checklist to 27 other governing and policy boards and commissions whose members are required to annually submit financial disclosures to the city clerk.¹ Four boards did not respond to the survey.

Introduction

What is Good Governance?

Governance is the exercise of authority, direction, and control by a governing board. Governance deals with *what* an organization is to do and is focused on planning, setting goals and objectives, and developing policies to guide the organization and monitor its progress toward implementation of its plans. The primary focus of governance should be on the long-term – the organization's mission, values, policies, goals, objectives, and accountability.²

Boards and commissions should follow good governance practices as they spend public funds for the public good or enact and implement policy decisions on behalf of the city.

A key to good governance is asking good questions. Board members should question management—and one another—to exercise authority and to provide direction and control. The good governance practices we examined are:

- Leading the organization.
- Setting policies delineating management responsibilities.
- Ensuring management compliance with board directives.
- Ensuring accountability for achieving organizational goals.
- Ensuring a high level of board performance and effectiveness.
- Representing the public.

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Findings and Recommendations

Self-Reported Survey Responses Identify Governance Strengths and Some Areas of Governance Risk

Responses to the self-assessment checklists identified areas where boards and commissions reported incorporating good governance practices into their activities. The responses also identified opportunities to incorporate additional practices to mitigate risks that can have a negative impact on board performance and achieving organization goals. Without good governance practices in place, boards and commissions may not mitigate those risks.

Some Boards Appear Unaware of Requirement to Submit Annual Financial Disclosures

Some board members may not be submitting conflicts of interest forms as required. This year's governance assessment checklist asked, "Have all board members submitted financial disclosure statements to the city, if required." All boards we surveyed have at least some portion of their members who are required by city code to submit a financial disclosure report annually to the city clerk. ³

Seven boards reported that the conflict of interest disclosure requirement was not applicable to their board. Three boards reported that they "don't know." (See Exhibit 2.) We added this new question because our 2022 audit⁴ showed that 122 board members did not file their financial disclosure forms that year, as required by city code.

Lack of financial disclosure submission has been an ongoing issue for the city. The city is exposed to significant risks related to these governing and policy boards if board members do not submit financial disclosures as required.

First, when a board members' financial interests are not disclosed, the city is at risk of board members making policy or financial decisions in their own interests without this unethical behavior being known. The financial disclosure form provides transparency to the public and helps avoid even the appearance of conflicts of interest.

A second risk is that board members who fail to file the annual financial disclosure are automatically resigned from the board based on two sections of city code.

"Failure to file. Any member of a city board, commission or other entity who is appointed by the mayor or one or more members of the city council who fails to report by June 1 of each year **shall be deemed to have resigned membership, and this resignation shall be deemed accepted as of June 1 of the respective year**. Any entity listed in subsection (d) with a member not appointed by the mayor or one or more members of the city council failing to file the required disclosure report shall be subject to termination or suspension of any funding or other assistance provided by the city until all required disclosures are made." (emphasis added)

This has serious implications. Board members could continue to act as members of these city governing or policy boards even though they are no longer board members. Another is that if too many people from one board do not file, that board may not have a quorum to operate.

Recommendation

To ensure all board and commission members file required annual disclosures, the Mayor should send a letter to all boards and commissions identified in City Code Sec. 2-2024(d) reminding them of their obligation to submit annual financial disclosure statements to the city clerk and informing them of the consequences for failing to file.

Recommendation

To ensure any board or commission members who have automatically resigned for their failure to submit a required annual financial disclosure no longer serve, identify vacant seats that need to be filled, or board members to be reappointed, the Mayor should ask the city clerk to provide a list of all board and commission members who did not submit their required annual financial disclosure on or before June 1, 2023, and take appropriate actions.

City Council Can Take Steps to Improve City Boards' Governance Practices

The checklist responses and this report are tools to help the Mayor and City Council assess the governance practices of Kansas City boards and commissions and identify any concerns.

While evaluating the responses, Councilmembers should consider whether survey responses "No", "N/A", and "Don't Know" pose governance risks for these boards and the city.

The City Council is responsible for overseeing boards and commissions. The City Council develops rules for their operation and can hold them accountable for not following good governance practices.⁶ In most cases, the Mayor appoints board members and commissioners.

The City Council can evaluate each board survey response along with the duties and responsibilities of the board to determine appropriate action. Some boards have significant financial oversight, while others may have more of an advisory or policy role. Because of this, not all governance practice may apply to every board. Additionally, since this is the first time that these boards received the checklist, there may be a lack of familiarity with the core governance practices. If the City Council is unsure, they may discuss their questions with the board.

Below are some strategies the City Council can use when evaluating boards' potential risks:

- Assess whether the governance practice is applicable to the board.
- Attend board meetings to assess and ask questions.
- Ask board members to attend City Council committee meeting to discuss governance practices.

Following are steps the City Council can consider taking if they determine a particular board's governance practices have opportunities for improvement:

- Publicly encourage board or commission to incorporate good governance practices.
- Issue a resolution directing the board or commission to incorporate good governance practices.
- Engage governance expert to work with boards to implement good governance practices.
- Direct the city auditor to follow up with boards to reassess implementation of good governance practices.
- Strengthen the Code of Ordinances to require that boards adopt/incorporate good governance practices such as an attendance policy, board profile, or new board member orientation, and submit a follow-up report on their governance practices.

Assessment Responses by Core Governance Practices

This section summarizes each board's self-reported responses by core governance practice. Out of 27 boards surveyed, 4 did not respond as required by city code.

Leading the Organization

Boards and commissions should lead their organizations. They should ensure that the purpose for the organization is defined and establish overall goals for the organization.

Responses from the survey indicate that most boards and commissions have adopted practices to lead their organizations including preparing a mission statement, performing long term strategic planning, and setting overall goals for the organization. (See Exhibit 3.)

Boards that do not establish leadership practices leave their organization vulnerable to several risks including:

Undefined organizational purpose

- No consistent strategy
- Inefficient use of or insufficient resources
- No concrete goals to measure success and hold people accountable

Setting Policies Delineating Management Responsibilities

To strengthen the accountability and effectiveness of the organization, boards should adopt policies that clearly define board and management responsibilities.

Most responding boards and commissions reported having adopted policies that prohibit unethical or unacceptable actions by management. Less than half of the responding boards and commissions reported having policies outlining CEO (or equivalent senior executive position) powers, prescribing CEO-Board relationship, or guide financial planning, revenue, and expenditures. (See Exhibit 4.)

Policies delineating responsibilities within the organization help reduce inefficiency stemming from miscommunication and misunderstanding including:

- Board taking on management's day-to-day roles
- Management not taking responsibility for the implementation of organizational goals
- Management not budgeting or operating with sound financial practices
- Management using unethical methods to achieve organizational goals

Ensuring Management Compliance with Board Directives

Boards and commissions should have assurance that management is working toward achieving organizational goals at a reasonable cost.

Most responding boards and commissions reported specifying what the CEO (or equivalent senior executive position) must report on and when. Only a few of the responding boards and commissions reported providing for the external review of their financial statements while most reported this as not applicable to their board. (See Exhibit 5.)

Boards rely on information provided to them by management about the operation of the organization. Policies establishing the content and frequency of management reports, as well as policies requiring external expertise to confirm report reliability, can address inherent conflict of interest risks of management reporting on their own performance.

Ensuring Accountability for Achieving Organizational Goals

Boards and commissions should continually monitor progress towards accomplishing the organization's mission and evaluate whether goals are relevant.

At least half of the responding boards and commissions reported monitoring the organizations' progress toward accomplishing their mission and reviewing and updating their policies, mission statement, and goals in the last four years. (See Exhibit 6.)

Boards cannot know whether organizations are making progress toward their mission, whether their goals are achieved, or whether their goals are still relevant without evaluating progress. Additionally, without this evaluation boards may lose the opportunity to identify necessary resources based on updated goals and policies that are relevant to the success of their organization. If the board does not hold the CEO (or equivalent senior executive position) responsible for achieving organizational goals or assessing performance, the organization is at risk of not making progress towards its mission.

Ensuring High Board Performance and Effectiveness

To ensure a high level of board and commission performance and effectiveness, boards and commissions should establish policies and procedures to govern their own activities.

Most boards reported setting and controlling boards' agendas; adopting policies for conducting meetings; by-laws; a code of

ethical conduct; a conflict of interest policy; and new member orientation. Less than half report adopting and enforcing an attendance/absenteeism policy while only four boards reported performing self-evaluations. (See Exhibit 7.)

Without policies guiding their operations, boards risk:

- Lack of participation or attendance
- Non-compliance with laws
- Unethical behavior, such as making decisions in members' own interest
- Not understanding member duties
- Ad hoc or reactionary operation

Representing the Public Interest

Board members' behavior should reflect the belief that they are trustees for the citizens. City boards and commissions should represent the people of Kansas City. Residents are the ultimate owners of organizations governed by city boards and commissions.

All boards reported complying with Missouri Sunshine Law⁷ which requires public meeting notices of meetings open to the public. As organization owners, the public has a right to know what the board is doing. Most boards reported assessing the needs and concerns of the people in Kansas City. Less than half reported having meetings with the Mayor and City Council, developing a board profile to help in choosing candidates for board appointments, or creating job descriptions for board candidates. (See Exhibit 8.)

Due to the nature of boards focusing on niche or special issues, and appointed membership they face risks to the way they represent the public such as:

- Special interest groups outweighing the needs, concerns, and demands of the general public
- Lack of community or constituency engagement in the decision making process
- Lack of transparency in decisions made or the impacts of those decisions
- Minority or disadvantaged populations not being consulted or included in the decision making process

Additional Questions to Provide Context for Board Makeup and Encourage Board Participation in Good Governance Survey.

This year, we added additional questions to encourage boards and commissions to complete this checklist collaboratively. (See Exhibit 9). Most of the boards reported discussing this survey collaboratively among their members and during a public meeting.


We also asked questions about demographics of board members and board vacancies. (See Exhibits 10, 11, & 12). We found that most of the boards and commissions reported that 100 percent of members were Kansas City, Missouri residents. Nine of the responding boards and commissions reported that its boards members did not or could better represent Kansas City, Missouri demographics. Most of the boards and commissions reported having at least one vacancy.


Exhibit 10: Percent of Board Members KC, MO Residents Exhibit 11

Recommendations

- 1. The Mayor should send a letter to all boards and commissions identified in City Code Sec. 2-2024(d) reminding them of their obligation to submit annual financial disclosure statements to the city clerk and informing them of the consequences for failing to file.
- 2. The Mayor should ask the city clerk to provide a list of all board and commission members who did not submit their required annual financial disclosure on or before June 1, 2023, and take appropriate actions.

Appendix A: Objective, Scope and Methodology, and Compliance Statement

We conducted this performance audit of boards and commissions' governance practices under the authority of Article II, Section 216 of the Charter of Kansas City, Missouri, which establishes the Office of the City Auditor and outlines the city auditor's primary duties.

A performance audit provides "objective analysis, findings, and conclusions to assist management and those charged with governance and oversight with, among other things, improving program performance and operations, reducing costs, facilitating decision making by parties with responsibility for overseeing or initiating corrective action, and contributing to public accountability."8

Why We Did This Audit

Boards and commissions are responsible for overseeing important public functions and activities in Kansas City, including approving property tax abatements, advertising and booking conventions in the city, and determining city employee retirement benefits.

The checklist responses and report are tools the Mayor and City Council can use to assess the governance practices of Kansas City boards and commissions.

Audit Objective

This report is designed to answer the following question:

 What governance practices are the city's boards and commissions following?

Scope and Methodology

Section 2-722 of the Code of Ordinances (code) requires that the city auditor distribute a governance assessment checklist at least once every four years to component units⁹ and appropriate

governing or policy boards of the city. The code requires boards and commissions receiving the checklist to reply to the city auditor by April 30 and that a report be presented to the council by November 1. The checklist is required to be substantially similar to the one developed for the 2001 *Good Governance Practices for Boards and Commissions* report. For the other governing and policy boards surveyed, some questions were removed from the checklist as they would likely not apply to the selected boards and commissions. (See Appendix B for a copy of the checklist distributed.)

This audit summarizes the governance practices of 27 boards and commissions that are required to file financial disclosures with the city clerk's office but are not considered city component units. These 27 boards and commissions were selected as they are responsible for important functions such as making policy, financial, or equity decisions on behalf of the city.

We sent assessment checklists to 27 boards and commissions on March 1, 2023, an initial reminder on March 29, 2023, and a final reminder on April 26, 2023. Four boards did not respond to the survey.

The survey information contained in this audit is self-reported. We did not verify responses to the survey questions or determine their reasonableness. We drew conclusions based on the responses received to the checklist questions.

Statement of Compliance with Government Auditing Standards

We conducted this performance audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives. No information was omitted from this report because it was deemed confidential or sensitive.

Scope of Work on Internal Controls

We did not assess internal controls as part of this audit because we determined they were not significant to the audit objective.
