### What Are Brownfields?

"Brownfields" are any vacant or underused properties, mostly commercial or industrial, where reuse is complicated by real or perceived environmental contamination.

For instance: a former gas station, a building with asbestos and lead-paint, a closed industrial plant, or an old drycleaner.



#### What Are Brownfields?

Brownfields cause blight, health risks, and economic and environmental burdens, especially in communities of color and urban areas.

Redevelopment of Brownfields can transform communities by replacing blight with new investment, clean environment, and opportunities.



## Kansas City Brownfields Program

We help public and private redevelopment of brownfield sites with environmental assessments and cleanup funding using grants from EPA.



### **Environmental Assessment**

- Phase I (preliminary site and records review)
- Phase II (soil and groundwater tests)
- Hazardous materials surveys (asbestos and lead paint)



### **Environmental Assessment**

 Phase I assessment takes approximately 60-90 days from request to report.

 Phase II or hazardous materials survey can take 90-180 days, depending on site complexity.



# Cleanup - Revolving Loan Fund (RLF)

- Loans are available from the Revolving Loan Fund (RLF).
- Anyone with site access and who is not responsible for the contamination may apply for a loan.
- Subgrants are available to non-profits and governmental or quasi-governmental entities.
- Applications go to the Brownfields Commission and City Council for approval. Special eligibility rules apply for property owners and sites.
- Approval takes approximately 4 months.

# Zhou B Art Center, 1818 E. 19th St.

- Former Attucks Elementary School
- \$500,000 loan from Coalition RLF.
- Abatement of lead-based paint, asbestos.
- Renovation for art gallery, performance art, nonprofits, and event space





# Historic Northeast Lofts, 5401 Independence Ave., 601 Hardesty Ave.

- Hardesty Federal Complex: 22 acres, 1.2 million square feet, vacant over 40 years.
- Developer proposes \$225 million mixeduse project: 500 affordable units, 55,000 SF retail, daycare center, and 2 MW solar.
- \$2.8 million in Brownfields have already removed asbestos, lead and PCBs from 481,000 SF.
- Developer has been partially approved for \$5.6M Brownfields loan for cleanup of remaining buildings, approx. 663,000 SF.





# Mattie Rhodes Cultural Arts Center, 1017-1023 W. 17<sup>th</sup> St.

- New Center expands space for public galleries and student art programs.
- Brownfield assessment funding identified lead and arsenic contamination in soil
- \$200,000 RLF subgrant funded part of the cleanup
- Cleanup completed in June 2021
- Opened April 2022





# "Buck" O'Neil Education and Research Center Former Paseo YMCA, 1824 Paseo Boulevard


- Center will teach the science and math of baseball and Negro Leagues history
- Expands facilities of Negro Leagues Baseball Museum (NLBM)
- 100-year-old building contained asbestos, lead paint, mold and pigeon waste
- Cleanup took 15 years and \$725,000 in EPA Brownfield grants and City funds
- NLBM expects to open the Center by the end of 2023





# East Garfield Senior Cottages 3800 block of Garfield Ave.

- Ivanhoe Neighborhood Council (INC) is building eight 2-bedroom units
- \$1.8M Project, with CCED and HUD HOME grants
- Brownfields Program found lead and arsenic contamination in soils
- Impacted soils were excavated in coordination with site grading
- Ready for occupancy by the end of 2023





# **Urban Core Vacant Lots Example: 3817 Brooklyn Ave.**

- 50% of vacant lots in Kansas City, MO contain lead above Missouri residential levels.
- Lead comes from old paint, old leaded gas, lead smelters and other industrial sources.
- Lead causes life-long, irreversible harm to brain and other organs in young children.
- Child lead poisoning in KC neighborhoods is up to nine times the national average.
- Demand for affordable housing is driving development on vacant lots.
- Kansas City is working with neighborhoods and EPA to test and cleanup vacant lots.

# Why?

- \$1.5 Billion Brownfields Funding in Bi-Partisan Infrastructure Law
- Increased Local Project Demand
- First-Come First Served No Longer Appropriate
- Identify Strongest Projects That Benefit Impacted Communities



## **Funding Was Available from Four Grants**

Kansas City, MO	Available
Coalition Assessment Grant	\$210,366
Coalition Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) Grant	\$483,000
Regional Coalition (Jackson County, MO; KCMO; Wyandotte County/KCK)	
Kansas City, MO Community-Wide Assessment Grant	\$146,306
Kansas City, MO Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) Grant	\$761,000

We Anticipate that Applications for More Assessment and RLF Cleanup Funds will be Accepted in 2024 or 2025



#### How Did It Go?

#### 21 Total Submissions

- 16 Assessment Requests -> 13 Eligible (Total \$440,200)
- 14 RLF Requests ->8 Eligible (Total \$5,310,000)
- 7 Eligible for Both



## **Eligibility for Assessment**

- 1. Must Identify Eligible Site(s)
- Must Not Have Caused or Contributed to Contamination
- 3. Must Have Site Ownership or Legal Access



## **Eligibility for RLF**

- 1. Must Identify Eligible Site(s)
- 2. Must Own the Cleanup Site(s)
- 3. Must Not Be Legally Responsible For Cleanup

  Must Have a Phase I Environmental SITE

  ASSESSMENT 6 MONTHS BEFORE SITE ACQUISITION



# **Scoring The Eligible Projects**

- Assessment and RLF Requests Scored Independently
- All Reviewers Scored Averaged
- Bonus Added for Assessment Applications That Responded to Optional RLF Sections (1/6 of points)



#### Recommendations to the Commission

#### **Factors Considered**

- Scoring
- Shovel Readiness
- Estimated Cost v. Available Funding
- Project Location (Coalition Members)
- Potential Cost Sharing



#### Results

11 assessment projects approved

 4 projects invited to submit full applications for RLF loans and subgrants

Approved at Brownfields Commission Meeting 10/27/23




## Other Brownfield Funding
