The meeting was called to order at 4:10 pm; a quorum was present

- A. Welcome and Introductions Co-chairs Carol Adams and Bob Berkebile welcomed commissioners, staff, and guests who introduced themselves.
- B. Minutes A motion was made by Ben Proffer, seconded by Molly Davies, to approve the minutes of the meeting of March 8, 2017; the motion passed.
- C. KCMO Health Department, Environmental Programs Dr. Archer, Director Overall assumption there is overlap between public health and environmental management.

- G. Office of Environmental Quality Jerry Shechter
 - 1. Dennis Murphey was in Jefferson City today offering testimony on SB 458, sponsored by Sen. Jason Holsman. He addressed an element of the Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act (MEEIA) which prohibits low and moderate

income multifamily housing developments that have received Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC), and/or Historic Preservation Tax Credits, from also being eligible for energy effici8ency rebates from utilities. This has an impact on many developments including the Passive Haus multifamily development at 2nd & Delaware. The City has an interest in this development having committed funding support from several sources.

- 2. The next reporting deadline under the Energy Empowerment Program is May 1, 2017. This deadline requires energy use by private sector buildings of 100,000 square feet or more to be reported in addition to City buildings. The next reporting deadline, of May 1, 2018, adds private sector buildings of 50,000 square feet or more.
- 3. April 22, 2017 is the March for Science in Washington Square Park from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. April 29, 2017 is the Peoples' Climate March, in Washington Square Park, from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.
- Paseo High School students will participate in an Earth Day event at Science City on April 22, 2017 addressing
 perceptions of the environment.
- 5. All three general obligation bonds passed.

H. Legal Brief - Matt Gigliotti -

- a. Since 2010, the State of Missouri has had a clean water and a drinking water revolving loan fund. A decision was made to reduce the administrative fee, effective 1.1.18, to 0.5% from 1.0%. Cities, the borrowers, will have to pay less for loans allowing more available for programs.
- b. The Missouri Clean Water Commission will have new commissioners installed and there will be no new actions until that takes place.
- I. Old Business Ben Proffer expressed concern about HB 340 which adds fees to utility b8ills for use of solar PV.

J. New Business –
