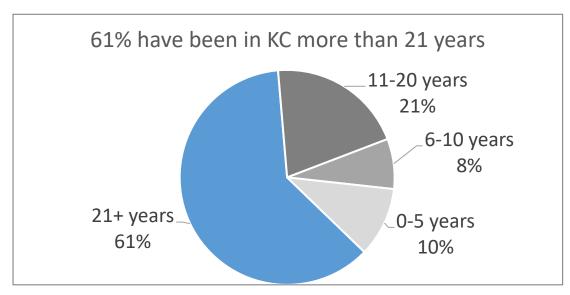

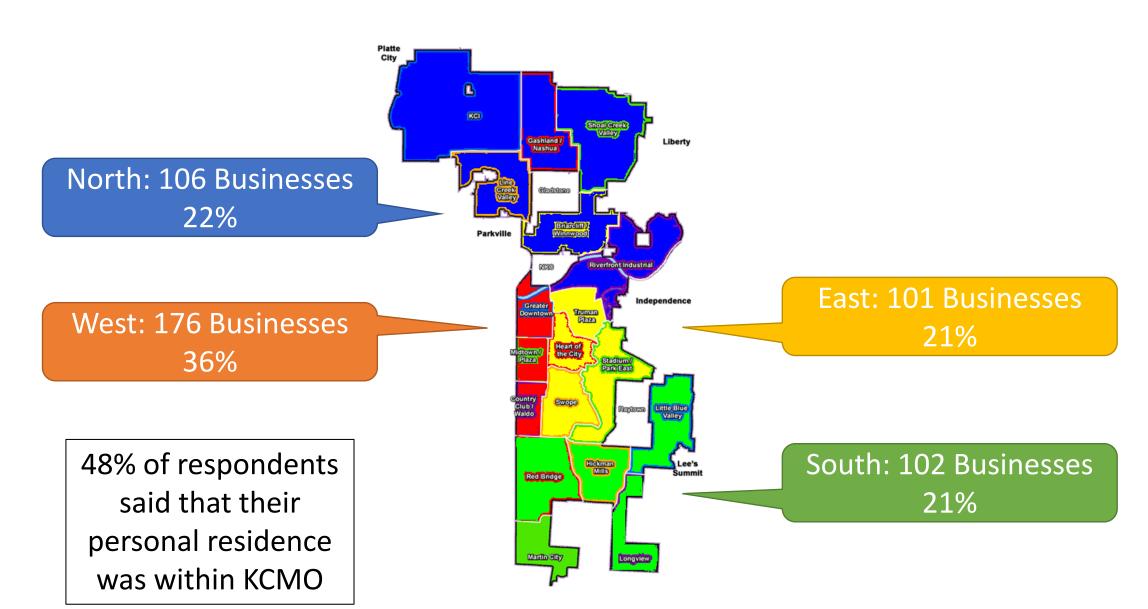
Additional Characteristics of Businesses Responding



- 76% of businesses are sole proprietorships (18% 2-5 locations, 6% 6+)
- 51% lease, 48% own
- 28% have done business with the city as a vendor or contractor
- 11% report that they are minority owned businesses and 20% report that they are women owned businesses (5% are both)
- 44% of respondents are the owner of the business and 44% are a manager (5% CFO and 7% other)

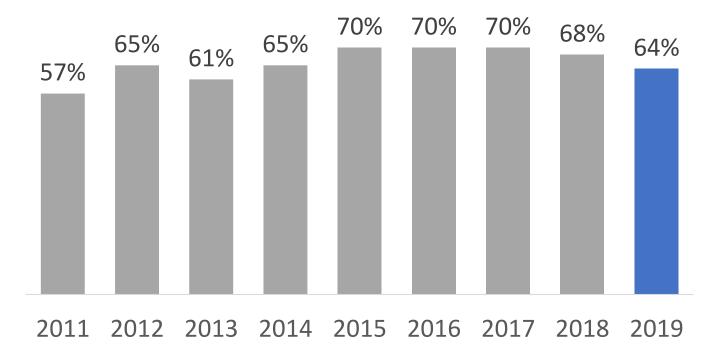






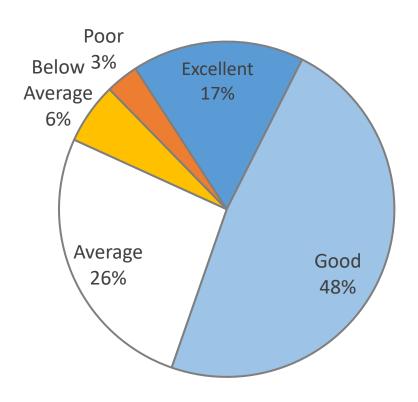
Kansas City as a Place to Do Business

Rating of KC as an "excellent" or "good" place to do business dropped, but change is not statistically significant



Businesses rating Kansas City as an "excellent" place to do business dropped from 23% to 17%

Only 9% of businesses rate KC as a "below average" or "poor" place to do business



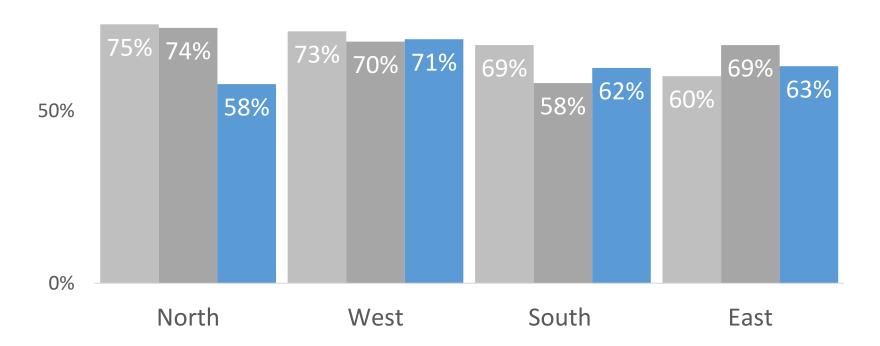

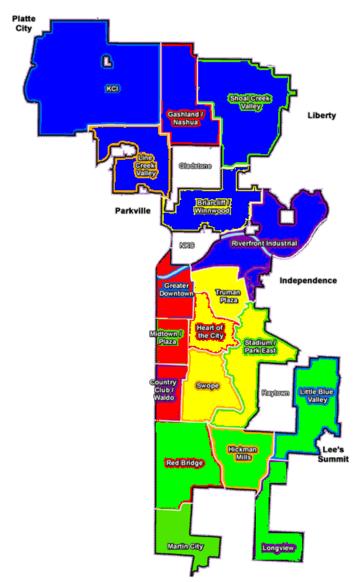


Ratings of "Kansas City as a Place to Business" declined in the North and East zones

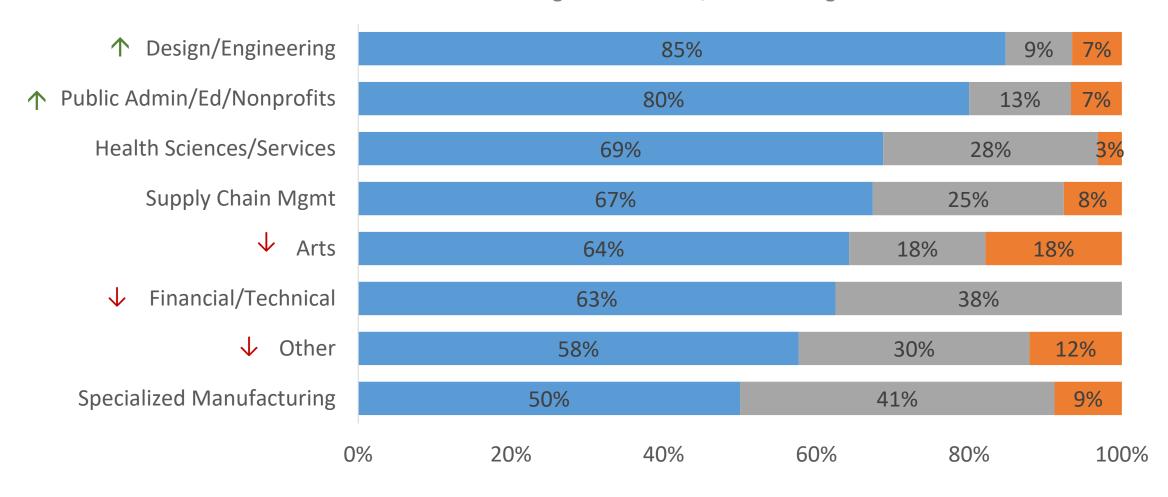




KC as a Place to do Business by Sector

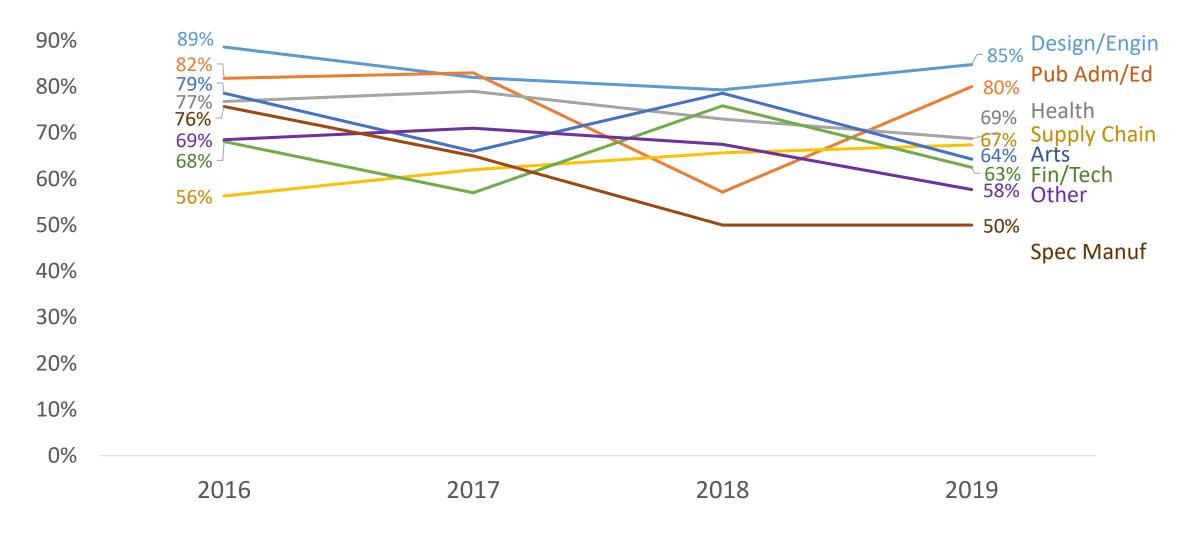

Arrow indicates change in "Excellent/Good" rating since 2018



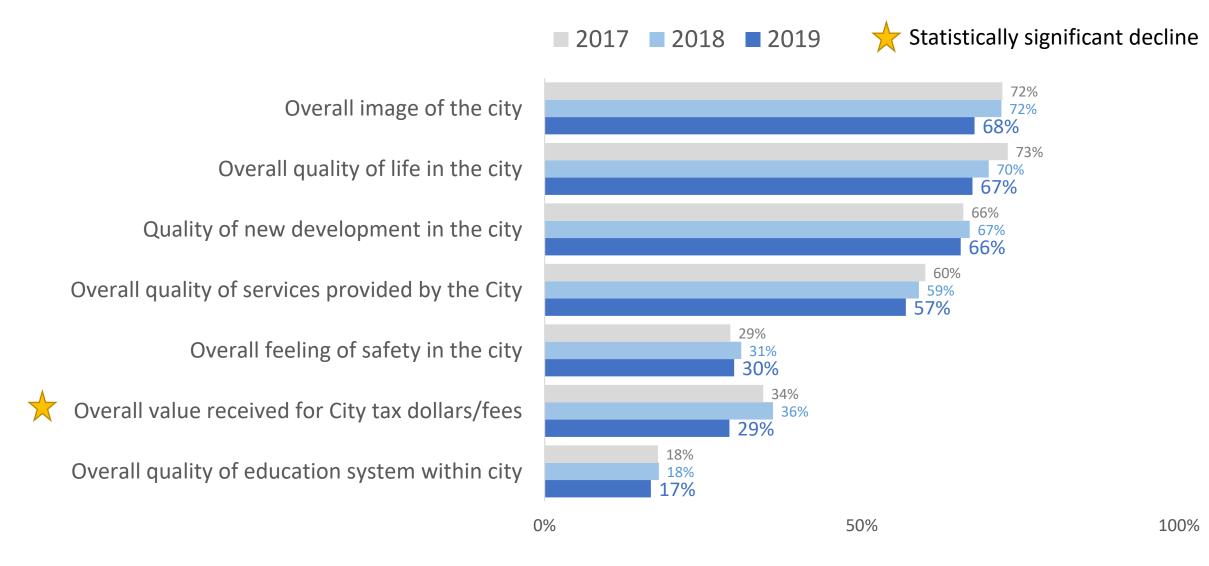
KC As a Place to do Business by Sector: Excellent/Good Trend over Time





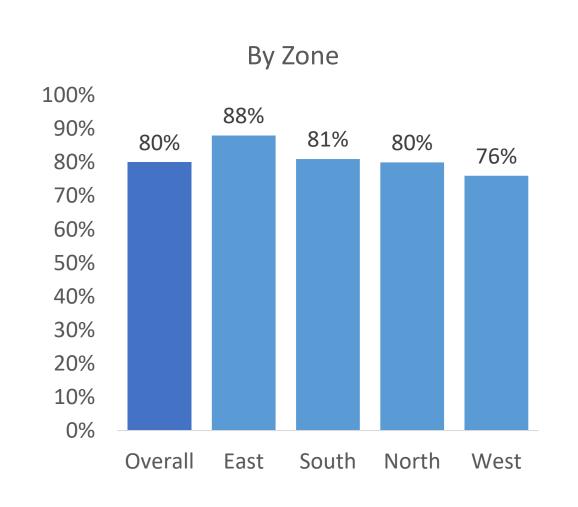

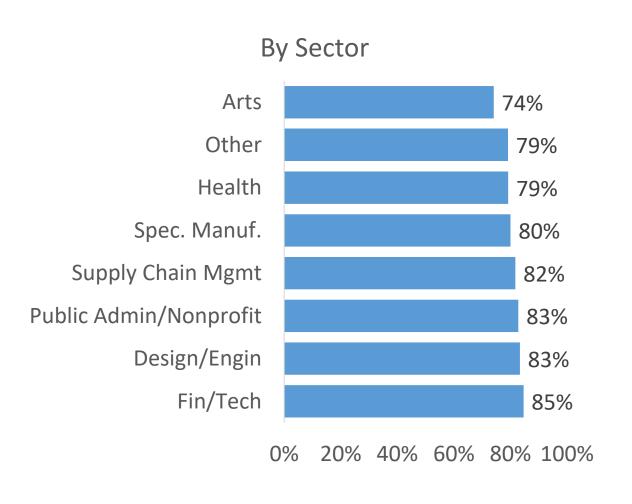




New Question: Do you think the City of Kansas City is Business Friendly?

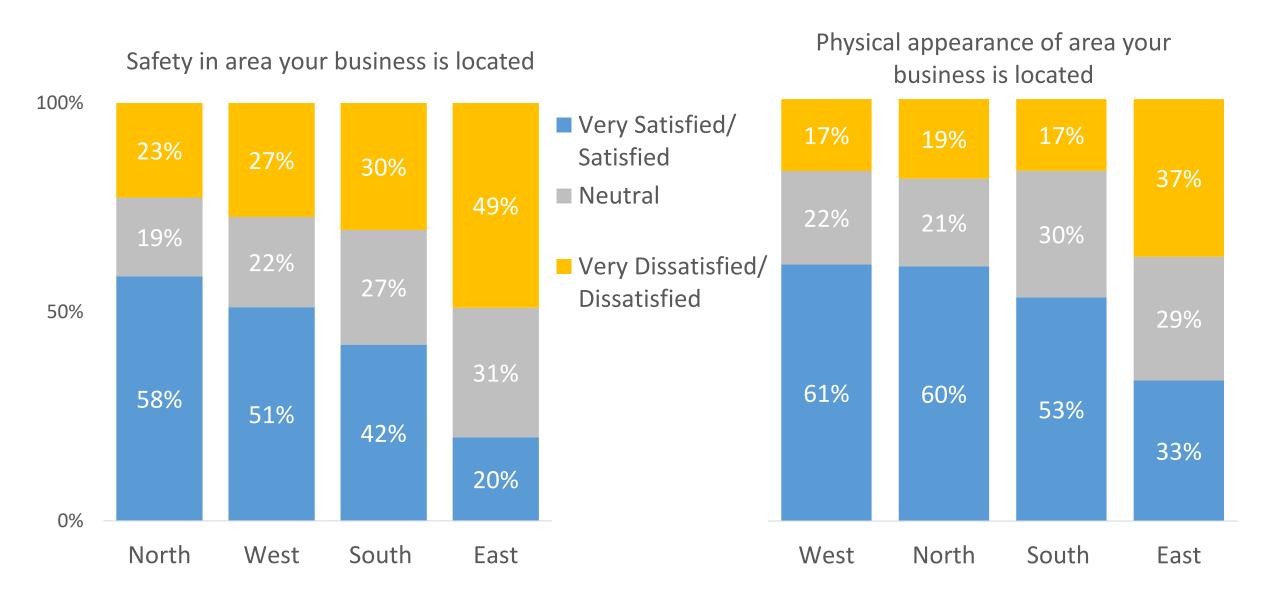






New Questions: Safety and Physical Appearance of Location of Your Business (by Zone)





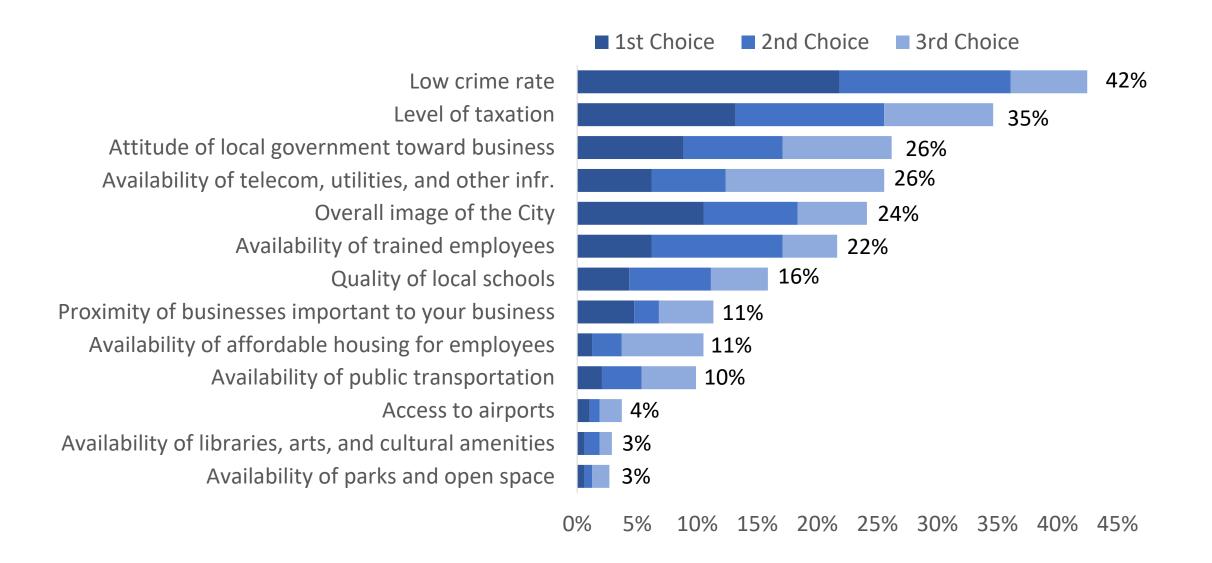

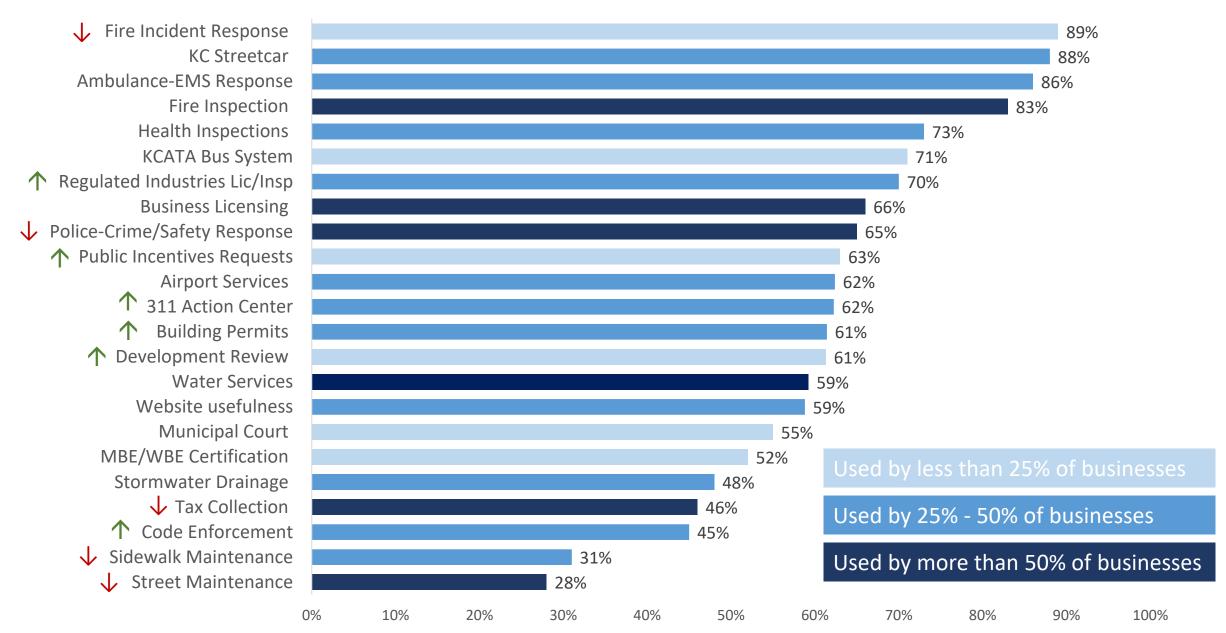
Which Three Reasons will have the Most Impact on your **Data** (C Decision to Stay in Kansas City for the next 10 years?

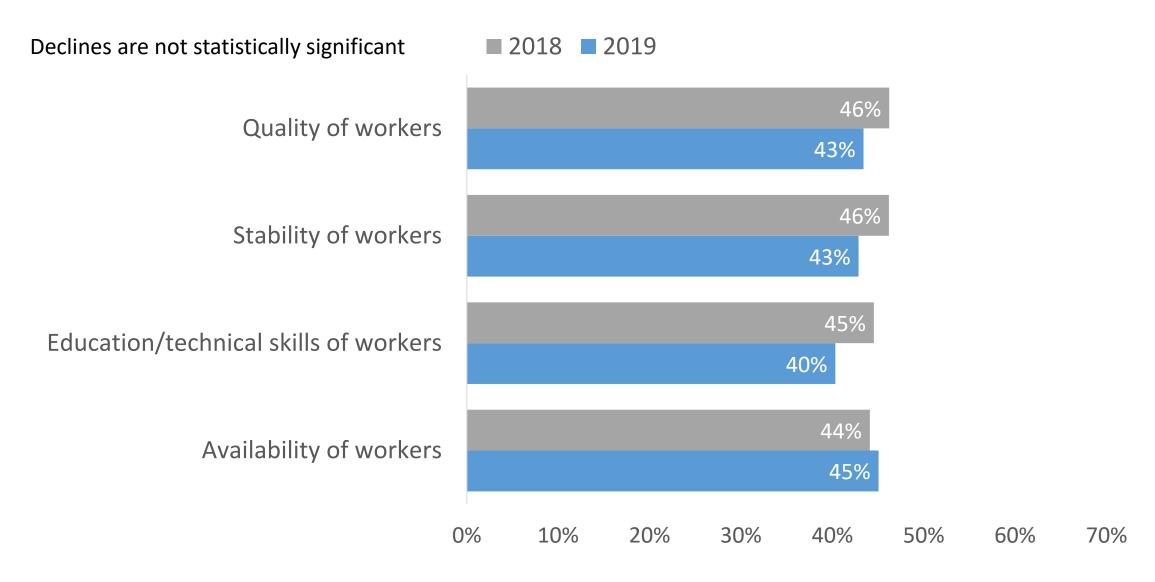

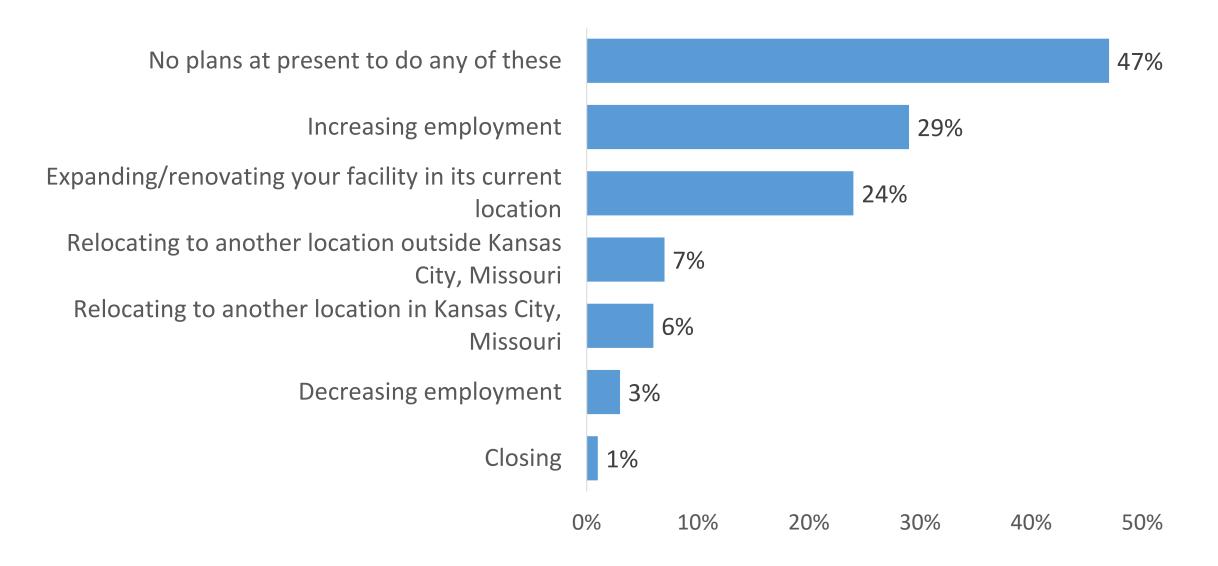

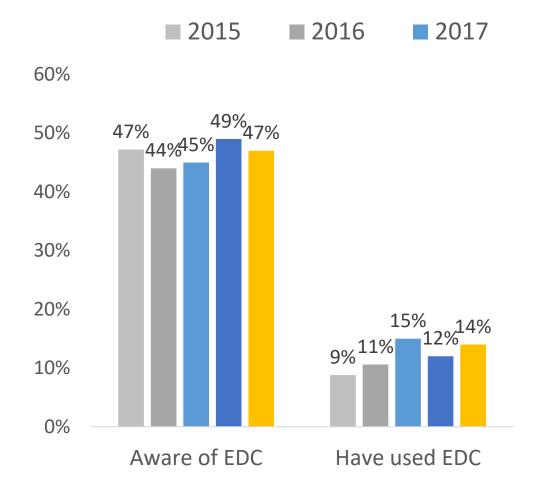

Change	Details		
Increasing employment (29%)	 38% of Specialized Manufacturing and Financial and Technical businesses; 13% of Arts businesses Median number of new hires = 4 Median wage = \$16.50/hour (most common: \$15/hour) 		
Relocating within KCMO (6%)	 Most common reason cited: Need more space Next most common: Location elements and cost/lease issues 		
Relocating outside of KCMO (7%)	 47% didn't provide location; 9% moving to another MO municipality; 15% moving to Johnson County; 15% moving to KCK; 6% moving outside the metro 15% of businesses referenced taxes and 15% referenced better services 		
Decreasing employment (3%)	 Of the 15 businesses that said that they would be decreasing employment, half said that they would have 5 or less layoffs. Most common sector (6 out of 15) was other 		
Closing (1%)	 Of the 7 businesses that said that they were closing, 4 were due to retirement and 2 cited crime as a factor. 		

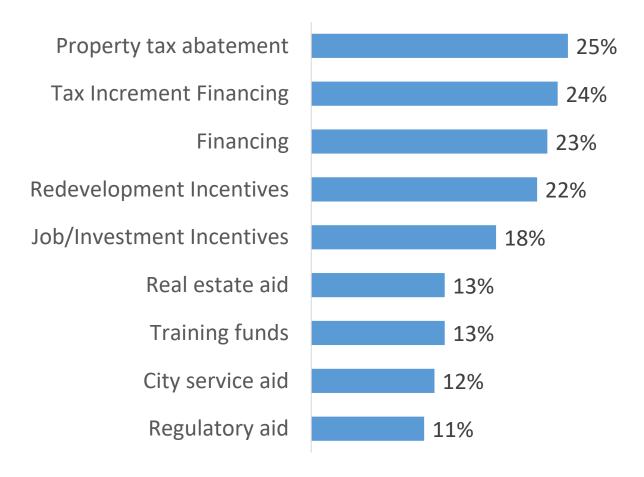






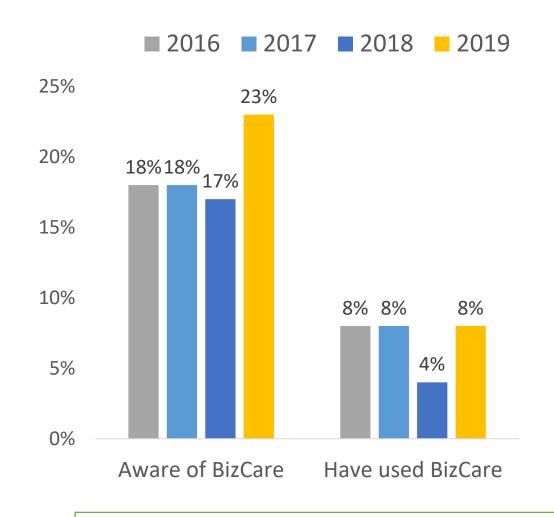

Percent of businesses that reported they were aware of this service from EDC

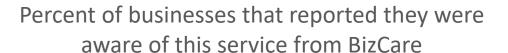


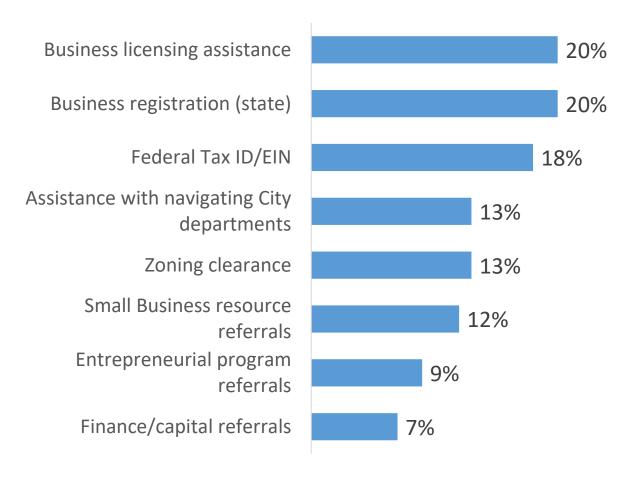

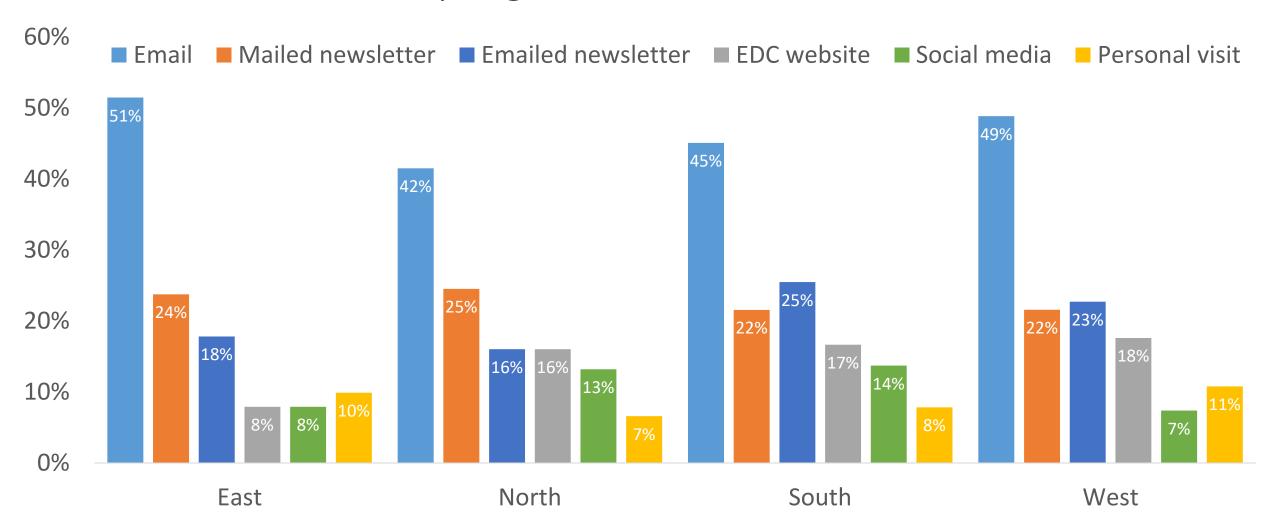

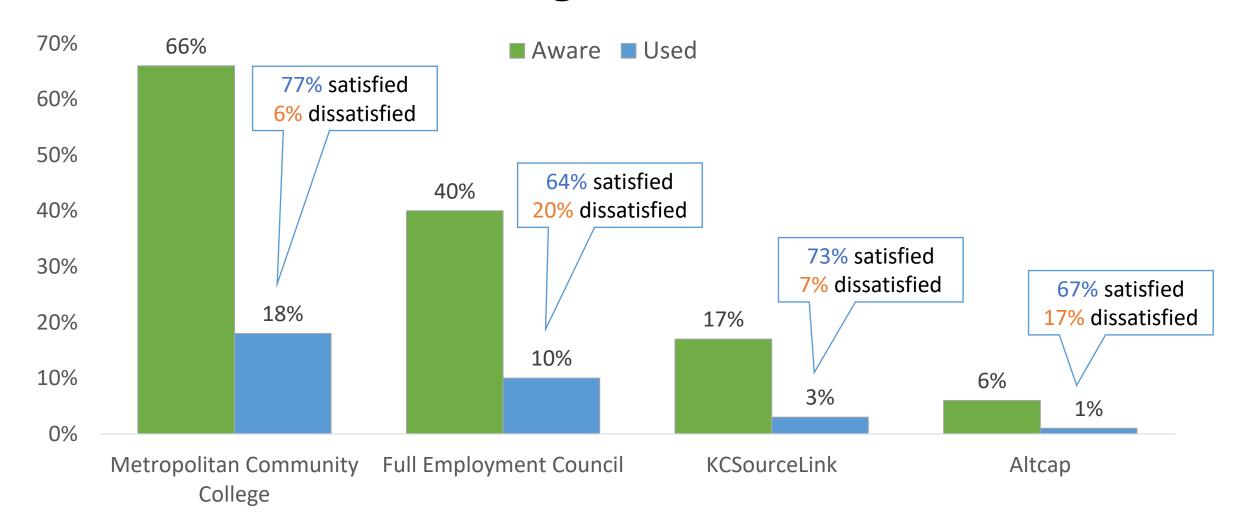
Preferred methods of getting information about **ata** business assistance programs

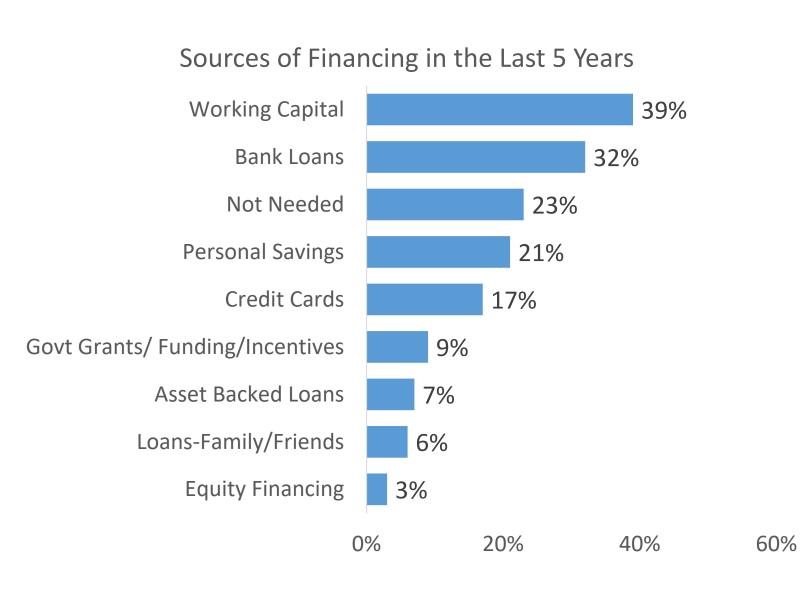


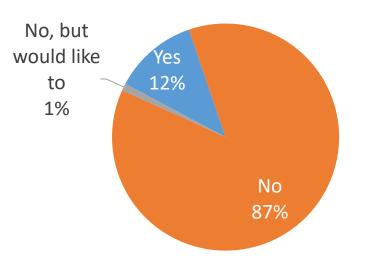
