Mayor's Houseless Taskforce working to ensure a coordinated response
Prioritize existing shelter beds and services
Identify additional space for use after shelter beds have been exhausted
Operationalize bed count data in real time



Houseless Solutions:Requests for Proposals

18 proposals evaluated based on timeline for completion, service delivery and clientele



Innovations in Housing: New Options

Hotel Conversion: Single room occupancy hotel transition into permanent supportive & transitional housing for homeless and low income families & individuals

Expansion of Amethyst Place: Permanent
supportive housing for single mothers/children

Semi-Permanent Shelters: Temporary housing in collaboration with Hope Faith

Hotel Conversion: Lotus Care House

Permanent Supportive Housing \$1.3 M

Single Room Occupancy for housing homeless & at-risk individuals

- \$900,000 property acquisition
- \$400,000 security, coordination services & resources for 12 months.

Days Inn Hotel – Owned by MP Lodging, LLC. 5100 Linwood Blvd, Kansas City, MO

- Tenant/Resident Structure built in partnership with KC Tenants
- Wrap around services by Lotus
- Housing for 100 individuals/households
 - Including serving 75 unhoused individuals w/medical needs
- Transition clients to stable housing



Amethyst Place Expansion: \$300k

1.28 acres tract of vacant land, 37 units

Supportive housing

East of Troost

Serving low income families


comprehensive family centered care

other sources of funding include Low Income Housing Tax Credits

Partnership: Amethyst Place & Sunflower Development Group

Semi-Permanent Shelters: \$1M





Partnership: Hope Faith & Merging KC

- \$550,000 shelter acquisition
- \$350,000 security, care coordination, services and resources
- Neighboring Hope Faith Center
- 24-hour security services
- Food, bathrooms, water and laundry onsite
- Case workers for coordinated care, counseling, employment assistance
- Transition to permanent housing options
