Sample Outcomes: Mobility Key Themes

Northland:

"Make communities more walkable and promote an active lifestyle."

Central:

"Having safe
sidewalks/crosswalks
for people walking or
on route to a bus
stop."

South:

"Public transit that is more accessible to community members in their neighborhoods."

 - South KC (11/9/21): 11 participants

Sample Outcomes: Natural Systems Key Themes

Northland:

"Amending city code to allow for native plant species and urban agriculture in residential areas."

Central:

"Increase tree canopy and burying power lines to combat heat islands."

South:

"Use climate considerations in how we look at existing and new green spaces."


